Lemonade Scones

If you think you can't make scones give this recipe a try!

Ingredients

12oz/300g Self raising flour (sifted) 2oz/50g Caster sugar 125ml Double cream 125ml Lemonade (not diet) 40ml (2 tablespoons) milk

Method

Pre heat the oven to 220C/gas 7. Place the flour and sugar in a large bowl. Add the cream and lemonade and mix to a soft dough. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface and knead lightly until smooth. Lightly roll the dough to a thickness of about 2cm. Use a 6cm round cutter to cut out 8 scones. Place these on an ungreased baking tray. Brush tops with either milk or beaten egg. Bake for 10-15 minutes until lightly browned. Cool and serve with your favourite jam.

The Friends of St Mary's

The year has started with a vengeance. We had planned to carry out modifications to the church porch timbers on the south west side which were suffering from some wet rot caused by a fault in the detail design of the porch. The structure, although not a danger was best altered before it became one. We therefore obtained tenders for the work and placed an order for it to be done in the new year. Unfortunately as soon as the order was placed the weather changed from damp to very wet and it was decided to delay the work until the timbers dried out.

Having decided to delay the start of the work on the porch we had a fall of an area of the ceiling plaster from above the stairs to the pulpit. Although preliminary examination indicated that there was no hazard from further falls of plaster it appeared that from the presence of what looked like beetle holes there could be a problem with Death Watch Beetle in one of the roof beams and a leak from rain water at the join of the chancel and nave roofs. The extent of the damage to the roof and ceiling of the chancel could only be determined by working from internal scaffolding with progressive removal of the roof tiles facilitating examination of the underlining chancel ceiling.

Specialist examination of the suspect beetle attack of the roof beam showed that the attack was not current and only required a minor amount of cosmetic work. The condition of the church timbers is covered by a 30 year guarantee from when the church timbers were all treated by Rentokil against Death Watch Beetle attack about 20 years ago.

We have so far obtained estimates for the cost of carrying out the necessary work to the church although due to the nature of the work it is not possible to cover all eventualities and reasonable contingencies have to be allowed for. We are proceeding and planning to carry out the work during the summer months. We do not anticipate any major delays to our church services whilst the work is carried out. We will also try applying for financial help as our emergency funds will be somewhat depleted by the cost of the work.

We are currently planning some of our fund raising activities with Quizzes, and a covert in the Autumn. We will also be opening the church again on the addays throughout the summer months so that you will be able to watch the progress. Keep your eyes open on the notice boards for more information.

A Bee-Friendly Garden for Spring

On these first warm and sunny days of spring, bees will appear in our gardens once again. I'm a beekeeper - and so I'm keen to create a truly bee-friendly garden so that when my honeybees fly on warm days they will find plenty to forage on. Flowers planted for honeybees are often loved by butterflies, bumblebees, and other pollinators, too - so I'm looking forward to a garden buzzing and humming with life.

Honeybees are facing different threats, from pesticides to the destruction of the habitats where they forage. Government policies are needed to protect our bees, of course, but I can also do something on a small scale in my garden, by not using pesticides and by buying flowers that haven't been treated with pesticides, either. I can also plant flowers that produce plenty of pollen and nectar (bee-food) for my honeybees to take back to the hives.

In early spring, the bees will enjoy snowdrops, winter aconites, hellebores and crocuses. They will love mahonia, viburnum, and the herb, rosemary. Among the trees and hedgerows they will seek out catkins and blackthorn blossom. By April, the colonies have built up, and the bees will be foraging on blossom from fruit trees and the flowers on horse chestnuts. They will also love grape hyacinths, wallflowers and clematis montana. They will look for wild flowers as well, in particular dandelions, usually considered a weed, but a favourite bee-flower. Since becoming a beekeeper, I'm not so quick to mow these down! Butterflies and other pollinators love dandelions, too.

It's no surprise that bees are drawn to yellow spring flowers, as yellow is a colour they can see. They can also, like us, see blue and green, but they can't see red. When they forage on red flowers such as field poppies, they see pigments that reflect ultraviolet (a colour we can't see, of course) and the colour of the pollen they collect from field poppies is dark blue.

The colour of pollen varies and so when bees bring pollen back to the hive they create a rainbow of colours on the comb. When bees are foraging, pollen becomes stuck to the hairs on their bodies - and while some of this is transferred to other flowers, the bees will comb the rest of the pollen from their hairs and pack it into the pollen baskets found on their hind legs. So, by watching the bees return to the hive with loaded pollen baskets and by glancing at my pollen-colour chart, I can tell which flowers the bees have been visiting.

Bees also need access to water and so I'll make sure that they find this in my garden. And on a warm day I'll spring clean the hives, replacing old comb with new. Good hygiene will help keep bee diseases at bay.

I'm sure my bees will be happy in my garden this spring, as they'll find plenty to interest them there. Now I'm planning a bee-friendly garden for the rest of the year, too.



services is different. Joint services will take place at the Baptist Church at 10.30am on the 13th July, and at St Mary's on 12th October (time to be arranged) On Remembrance Sunday, 9th November, our two Churches will, as usual organise the Service in the Village Hall at 10.45am with the laying of the wreath and the Cubs and Scouts on parade. On Monday mornings, a joint coffee morning takes place at the Emmanuel Hall at the Baptist Church, from 10.30am to noon, and anybody is invited to drop in.

On 27th September, St Mary's ran a coffee morning in the Church in aid of Macmillan Cancer Support as part of the World's Biggest Coffee Morning. Although numbers attending were a bit down on previous years, the event still raised £268.

On 5th October a Concert of sacred music was provided by the choir of the Most Holy Redeemer Catholic Church, Billericay. This is a choir with considerable experience, having performed widely across Europe, and we are most grateful to them for giving up their time to raise a total of £578. for St. Mary's funds.

Our Autumn Fair on the 16th November raised £449. Unfortunately, due to the continuing decline in the numbers supporting our Spring and Autumn Fairs, and the comparatively low return against the considerable burden on a relatively small number of people to run them, it has been decided not to hold them this year.

Quiz Nights have been less regular because of health problems, but our Charity Quiz on behalf of the Village Charity, the Parkinson's Society, did take place on 26th October, raising £256. Together with a collection in Church, £323. was paid over as St Mary's contribution to the 2013 appeal, and a further donation of £250 was included from the family of Church member Ralph Nurse, a Parkinson's sufferer, who had died earlier in the year. A further Quiz Night in aid of Church Funds, took place on 14th March and raised £327. It is hoped that one or two more Quizzes will be held in the year, but no dates have yet been decided.

As I write this, Easter is still a few weeks away but the lovely spring weather has arrived (however temporarily)! I find it quite ironic to discover that as far as we know Jesus never told His followers to remember or celebrate His birth - yet Christmas has become such an enormous celebration when churches have larger congregations than any other time of year. On the other hand we do know that Jesus did tell His followers to remember His death - hence the fact that most mainstream churches hold communion services regularly. Should we make more of Easter then? I think so. To me it is always so special to meet in church on Good Friday to remember what Jesus endured for us through His suffering and death on the cross, making it possible for us to find forgiveness, hope and peace. It is so good that it doesn't end there however because on Easter Sunday we met again to celebrate the fact that it was Friday, but Sunday came - and on Sunday came resurrection.

I have had the privilege of visiting Israel on five occasions, and each time one of the highlights has been the visit to the Garden Tomb in Jerusalem. Tradition says that the site of the Calvary and the Garden is where the Church of the Holy Sepulchre now stands, but I find the sight of the Garden Tomb much more convincing, situated as it is near an rocky cliff face that looks like the shape of a skull. The tomb dates back to New Testament times and of course it is empty. If you go in to have a look and then turn to leave you see these words written on the inside of the door, "He is not here, for He has risen!" I believe that to be true - do you? Something amazing must have happened to transform a group of broken, frightened, grieving people into a group that transformed the world and changed the course of history. They were willing to go anywhere and do anything - even pay the ultimate price - to persuade people to believe that Jesus is alive and can change people's lives.

He changed my life and so for me Easter is so special - an appreciation of Jesus death, and a celebration of His resurrection. I hope Easter is just as special for you.

Teddies for Tragedies Essex Branch

In the last Village Magazine I wrote that I had slowed things down a bit due to Alan's heart attacks , but in September I got into the act by falling headfirst down my stairs which resulted in a badly sprained wrist, enormous bruises, too many to count



and a broken neck. I don't do things by half!! This resulted in me having to spend two weeks in hospital and to wear a neck brace constantly for 12 weeks. However, as I write this I am still in the neck brace as my neck had not healed by the 12 weeks and I am due to see the Spinal Specialist at the beginning of April so fingers crossed I hope healing has taken place or I face an operation.

During this time I have managed to keep the charity work going with the help of family and friends. 2624 teddies have been distributed and I was delighted to get a call in December from one of my contacts who had already sent out 4 containers of food and much needed items to the Philippines and was sending a 5th container and wanted teddies for the traumatised children. I was able to give him just under 800 teddies and 58 clowns. Many blankets, jumpers and many margarine boxes filled with toiletries went to Kosovo and Zambia.

This winter, due to my condition I wasn't able to fill all the shoeboxes which I usually do, but all the items I had collected went to Blythswood Care and their volunteers filled them for me. Many people from the Village and our two Churches gave me their filled boxes which went to Eastern Europe giving much joy to children and adults alike.

I cannot express enough my gratitude and thanks to everybody in the Village and surrounding area for the love and support given to Alan and I over these difficult 6 months. How fortunate we are to live in a village like this.
