



As most of you are aware that we are still without a Pastor at this time. Rev. Geoffrey Griggs left us over a year ago and we are still seeking a replacement.





Mushroom Royal

Serves 2-4 people. 560 calories per portion

11oz (300 g) Potatoes peeled and cut 3oz (75g) Butter 9oz (250g) Mushrooms washed and sliced ½ Red pepper sliced ½ Yellow pepper sliced 1oz (25g) Flour ¼ pt (150ml) fresh milk 2 tspns (10ml) mustard 1tbsp (15ml) lemon Juice

METHOD

- 1. Cook Potatoes and mash them
- 2. Melt the butter and fry the mushrooms and peppers for 5 minutes. Stir in the flour and milk and bring to the boil. Stir in the mustard and lemon juice and place in an oven proof dish.
- 3. Spread the potato over the top and grill until golden. Piping the potato gives the dish a special finish.

£2 off

I was trying to lighten the weight of my handbag, and I came across some supermarket coupons. Most were out of date, but four were still viable. Well - we all have to think about saving the pennies.





On the Saturday afternoon, torrential rain marooned a number of people in the Church, but fortunately, there were no outside activities on that day. The rest of the weekend, when there were stalls and refreshments, including Ploughman's Lunches in the Church grounds, the weather was mixed, but remained dry. Probably the best weather was on Sunday afternoon, allowing the "Songs of Praise" service to be held in the open air. As a departure from the normal biblical theme, this year's floral displays, depicted Village Life Past and Present. Many thanks to the flower arrangers and stallholders, those who came along to assist erecting tents on Sunday morning and taking them down on Monday evening and all who helped in any way at this successful event, which raised £1850 for Church funds.

We continue to enjoy joint activities with our friends at the Baptist Church. Combined services were held at the Baptist Church on 8th July and at St Mary's on 10th October. On 11th November, members of both churches, the Cubs and Scouts and many people from the Village will gather at the Village Hall at 10:45 am for the annual Remembrance Day Service. Next year there will be a joint service at the Baptist Church at 10:30 am on 10th February, and on Palm Sunday, 24th March, members of both churches, together with people from the congregations of St Margaret's Downham and St Peter's South Hanningfield, will gather at the Baptist Church at 9:45 am for the distribution of palms and a procession to St Mary's for a combined service at 10 am.

On Monday mornings a drop-in coffee morning takes place at the Emmanuel Hall at the Baptist Church from 10:30 am to Noon. This is arranged jointly by the Baptist Church and St Mary's, but is not limited to church members. Everyone women or men, will be very welcome to drop in for a tea or coffee and a chat.

Fundraising events continue to be a necessary activity to help maintain our ancient church. The Spring Fair on 19th May raised £517. The Autumn Fair will be held at the Village Hall from 11 am to 2:30 pm on Saturday 3rd November. There will be cakes and Jams etc. on sale, and a number of other stalls, plus refreshments including our popular Ploughman's Lunches. We hope to see many of you there - admission is free.





The Friends of St Mary's

In the Church of England every church has to be inspected by a specialist architect every five years known as the Quinquennial inspection. Although the inspection is paid for by the Diocese, any work found to be needed has to be paid for by the individual church. Our Quinquennial inspection took place in April this year and a moderate list of jobs to be done was the result. We have been through the list, prioritized the items and selected a few which should be proceeded within our financial resources but with VAT at 20% about which the precise position on listed buildings is still not entirely clear and other contingencies it is just a matter of guesswork until we get a firm quotation to work on.

The initial work we have given top priority to will cover repairs to some of the church porch timbers and the replacement of some of the tower weather-boarding which is showing signs of rotting. The main porch framework is the same age as the tower timbers i.e. 15th century with some more recent repairs. Unfortunately it is the consequence of some of the design features of this later work which has been partly responsible for the restoration work now needed. When we have a firm price for the work we can then apply for grants towards the cost of the work which involves supporting the porch roof while one of the ground beams is replaced.


